Albertans Invited to Participate in Water Conversation

On February 5, Alberta Environment and Sustainable Resource Development (ESRD) announced that all Albertans are invited to participate in a conversation about how water is managed in the province.

Public sessions will occur in <u>20 communities</u> across the province, starting February 19. The closest sessions to the Wabamun watershed are in Edmonton, February 27, and Thorsby, March 13. Each session will be from 5:30 to 8:00 p.m. and ESRD will facilitate. Doors open at 5:00 p.m. If possible, plan to attend the session from the beginning. All are welcome—no registration required.

Those who cannot make the above discussions can participate in an online survey from February 11 to March 29. The discussions will focus on four areas:

- healthy lakes,
- · hydraulic fracturing and water,
- drinking water and wastewater systems, and
- water management.

"State of the Watershed" Report

The Wabamun Lake State of Watershed Report is well underway with the contractor, Aquality Environmental Consulting, working hard to pull together all of the information sources they will need to produce a comprehensive report. An initial meeting took place between Aquality and WWMC Board Members at the end of January to review and confirm the table of contents for the report. It is anticipated that the State of Watershed Report will be completed by June of 2013.

Blue-green Algae Workshop

Unlike many other recreational lakes in the province, Wabamun Lake does not have a serious blue-green algae problem—where the water becomes toxic, killing fish and wildlife, and threatening human health. However, that could change if water quality is allowed to deteriorate. The North Saskatchewan River Keeper and the Alberta Lake Management Society (ALMS) are sponsoring a workshop on toxic blue-green algae blooms in Alberta's lakes. Free of Charge!
